#### Mizoram

**Mizoram** is one of the states of Northeast India with Aizawl as its capital city. The name is derived from *Mi* (people), *Zo* (lofty place, such as a hill) and *Ram* (land), and thus Mizoram implies "land of the hill people". It is the southernmost landlocked state sharing borders with Tripura, Assam, Manipur and with the neighbouring countries of Bangladesh and the Chin State of Myanmar.

Like several other northeastern states of India, Mizoram was previously part of Assam until 1972, when it was carved out as a Union Territory. It became the 23rd state of India, on 20 February 1987.

Mizoram's population was 1,091,014, according to a 2011 census. It is the 2nd least populous state in the country. Mizoram covers an area of approximately 21,087 square kilometres. About 91% of the state is forested.

About 95% of current Mizoram population is of diverse tribal origins who settled in the state, mostly from southeast Asia, over waves of migration starting about 16th century but mainly in 18th century. This is the highest concentration of tribal people among all states of India, and they are currently protected under Indian constitution as a Scheduled Tribe. The tribes converted from Animist religions to Christianity over the first half of 20th century. Mizoram is one of three states of India with a Christian majority (87%).

Mizoram is a highly literate agrarian economy, but suffers from slash-and-burn *jhum* or shifting cultivation. In recent years, the jhum farming practices are steadily being replaced with a significant horticulture and bamboo products industry. The state's gross state domestic product for 2012 was estimated at Rs 6,991 crore (US\$1.0 billion). About 20% of Mizoram's population lives below poverty line, with 35% rural poverty. The state has about 871 kilometres of national highways, with NH-54 and NH-150 connecting it to Assam and Manipur respectively. It is also a growing transit point for trade with Myanmar and Bangladesh.

#### **Cheraw Dance**

The largest Cheraw (hnown as the Mizo bamboo dance) in the world was achieved by 10,736 dancers during an event organised by the Government of Mizoram in Aizawl on 12 March 2010. The Guinness world record dance took place on the day after the Chapchar Kut festival. This very colourful and distinctive dance of the Mizos is called 'Cheraw'. Little is known about the origin of Cheraw. Possibly the forefathers of Mizos brought it with them when they left their homes in far-east Asia. During the world record dance, 146 sets of dancers each formed by 16 people performed at the Assam Rifle Ground for a total of 2,496 dancers. The rest 515 Sets (515 x 16 = 8,240) performed along the road of Aizawl, from Chanmari to Sikulpuikawn covering 3 Kilometres.



Guinness World Records judge Lucia Sinigaliesi watched the dance along with tens of thousands of spectators. "This was easily the largest and longest bamboo dance ensemble performed anywhere in the world so far," Ms Sinigaliesi said after the event. This record breaking dance was broadcast in BBC news.

#### Aizawl



Aizawl the capital of Mizoram, is situated at about 1132 meters above sea level. It is a beautiful and bustling 112 years old city set on rigdges of steep hills. Flanked on the north by the craggy peaks of Durtlang, the hill city overlooks the valley of the river Tlawng and ranges of blue hill beyond. It is arilinked by daily flights from Kolkata, Guwahati and Imphal. It is also accessible to Silchar and Shillong by road.

Aizawl is located north of the Tropic of Cancer in the northern part of Mizoram. It is situated on a ridge 1,132 metres (3715 ft) above sea level, with the Tlawng river valley to its west and the Tuirial river valley to its east.

Aizawl has a mild, sub-tropical climate due to its location and elevation. It has features of humid subtropical climate but very rainy. In the summer the temperature ranges from 20-30 °C (68–86 °F), and in the winter 11-21 °C (52–70 °F).

As of 2011 census, Aizawl had a population of 293,416. Females constitute 50.61% of the population and males made up the remaining 49.39%. Mizos from various tribes make up the majority of the population. Christianity is the dominant religion in the city. Other religions include Islam, Buddhism and Hinduism.
